Our Thoughts


We want:

How To Address Invasive Aquatic Species And Preserve Lake Quality



Invasive Species – Weed Treatment

- Our predominant Invasive Species weeds
 - Eurasian Water milfoil
 - Curly Leaf Pond Weed
- Two weed mitigation practices are in use
 - Chemical treatment using herbicide 2,4-d, as recommended by lake ecosystem experts
 - Mechanical harvesting and removal
- Amount of treatment limited by funding and DNR allowances

Invasive Species – Weed Mitigation

- The DNR allows approximately 56 of the 700 total acres to be treated on our lake.
 - The LMPA is allowed to treat whatever is left <u>after</u> deducting acreage treated by individual homeowners.
 - Typically, the DNR allocates up to 28 acres to the LMPA for common area treatment
- The DNR requires that LMPA treatment areas benefit the lake community, not an individual homeowner.
 - The LMPA treatments are further from shore (150 feet and beyond) than an individual may treat.
 - We apply our DNR-permitted acreage to <u>the high traffic</u>, <u>recreational areas</u> commonly traveled by boaters that use our lake.
